

Temporary closure 7 February – 25 May 2023 LED lighting for the Berlinische Galerie

Following a successful 2022 with more than 162,000 visitors, Berlin's public art museum will close temporarily from 7 February. This will enable LED lighting to be installed in the interests of energy efficiency and sustainability. The conversion work has been organised by BIM Berliner Immobilienmanagement GmbH, the real estate company owned by Berlin that leases the property to the Berlinische Galerie.

From 26 May the museum will present three shows of contemporary work by Julius von Bismarck, Nasan Tur and Böhler & Orendt as well as the exhibition "Suddenly Wonderful: Visions for chunky 1970's architecture in West Berlin".

"The energy issue, especially opportunities to save energy and pursue sustainability, has been on our minds for years. A number of measures have been carried out already. We are now very pleased that the lighting for the exhibition rooms and other areas is going to be modernised." Dr Thomas Köhler, director

The museum shop in the foyer will remain open during this period; Café Dix will stay closed.
